Student Conduct Agreement

Being a student at Elevate Oklahoma is a privilege. In attending here I recognize that I am choosing to pursue a standard of excellence in my education and character development. As an Elevate Eagle, I will do my best to follow the guidelines below.

We Wills are key character traits that I will choose to grow in while at Elevate. The methods provided are clear examples that I will use as a starting point.

We will be **responsible**. This looks like: putting backpacks in the classroom when we arrive, and sitting upright during SOAR and class, as well as, listening to the one speaking.

We will be **patient**. This looks like: waiting for the teacher to dismiss us from lunch for recess, and waiting on the tile for parents to pick us up at the end of the day.

We will be **obedient**. This looks like: obeying right away, all the way, without challenge or complaint.

We will be **respectful**. This looks like: taking care of property, and cleaning up after ourselves, as well as, treating others how I want to be treated.

We will be **considerate**. This looks like: watching out for others and including them, and taking turns and not chanting for others to get out, as well as, checking in and asking permission before leaving the room.

We will be **attentive**. This looks like: considering how I can help those around me, and making eye-contact with people when they talk to me, as well as, taking initiative.

We will exercise **self-control**. This looks like: keeping all four legs of the chair on the ground, and not running into walls with empty hands or with objects/items.

We will **honor**. This looks like: not being a distraction, and using our words to communicate any issues to our teachers, as well as, speaking encouraging words to others.

I choose to uphold the values of Elevate: **Hear, Do, Be** (James 1:22) in both **hearing** God's voice, **doing** what He says, **being** His disciples, and **hearing** instructions, **doing** the work, **being** the best version of me.

I choose to live committed to being Christ-centered and following His love-oriented approach to life. I seek to follow the truth as outlined in scripture. I recognize that Elevate believes the

following:

We believe that the Bible is inspired, inerrant and is our reliable source in faith and life. It is God-breathed and given by his divine inspiration.

We believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. Very God of very God, begotten, not made, of one essence with the Father; through him all things were made. Who, for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became man; he was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended



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into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father [and the Son], who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one, holy and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and we look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

I recognize that as an Elevate Eagle my goal is to grow academically through a Biblical worldview. While I am at school, I will choose to make this a priority. Upon entering the building, I will turn in my electronic devices (phones, tablets, laptops, smart watches, etc.), and will not attempt to utilize my electronic devices without teacher approval so as to focus on my studies and not be a distraction to my peers. Additionally, I will not pursue romantic or physical relationships at Elevate since it is not the goal of my education.

I understand that the dress code is outlined as follows:

Clothes should be modest while representing a Christian lifestyle and be uplifting.

Shorts should be fingertip length or longer.

Shirts should not be spaghetti straps or strapless.

Heels should be 1" or less for greatest comfort and ease in movement.

If a student is wearing leggings, the shirt or dress must cover the bottom fully.
