





Vocabulary

seigneur = landlord of seigneury or farmland in New France

capote = hooded greatcoat rather like a parka, usually worn with a sash around the waist, popular with habitants of New France and French Canadian traders and trappers. The word is derived from the French word for "cape."

seigneury = long narrow strip of land extending off the Saint Lawrence River

- The seigneurial system was introduced to New France in 1627 by Cardinal Richelieu. Under this system, the lands were arranged in long narrow strips, called seigneuries, along the banks of the St. Lawrence River. Each piece of land belonged to the king of France and was maintained by the landlord, or seigneur.
- The seigneurial system was introduced because the St. Lawrence River was something like the "Highway of New France". The river provided water and a means of transportation, which enabled settlers with land along the St. Lawrence to be successful. Land along the river, therefore, was much in demand.

AFTER READING:

What was Louis doing while the Indians were attacking? guarding the gap in the wall left by the rotten pickets

Why do Louis and Madeleine believe that the sentries have deserted them? They haven't shot a musket or cannon since the Indians began their attack.

How does Madeleine want them to act to let the Indians think that there are more of them than there really are? by putting their gun through one hole to shoot, then another, and by shouting and talking to themselves.

What happened when Madeleine shot the musket? she nearly fell down because of the recoil of the gun. She was used to shooting with a pistol, which is smaller.

Chapter 8 (pp 77-84) - The Sortie

Characters: Pierre Fontaine, his wife, his 3 children (Anne, a boy, and Marie)

BEFORE READING:

Have you ever had to cross a busy street with no crosswalk? Were you scared? Tell what happened.

AFTER READING:

What was one of the things Madeleine told the women to do in the blockhouse? Stop crying, clean and load weapons, laugh and act like there's nothing to be afraid of to fool the enemy.

Why did Madeleine walk instead of run to the canoe and back? To make the Indians think it was a trick to draw them closer to the range of the muskets inside the fort.

Did Madeleine's plan to fool the Indians work? yes, until the girl and her brother ran

What family was in the canoe? Pierre Fontaine, his wife and 3 children (Anne, boy, Marie)

What jobs did Madeleine give to the men and boys? La Bonté was in the bastion with the cannon, Laviolette and Louis were in the other bastion; Gatchet and Alexandre were patrolling the palisade walls.

How did Laviolette know the time from the stars? The stars are in certain positions at certain times and can help tell the time. People at the time knew the stars well.

Why was the time just before dawn the most dangerous? That is the "favorite time" for the Mohawks to attack

What did the Indian light on fire? the bastion that Louis was in

Why did Louis stay in the bastion even though it had been set on fire? He thought it was a distraction, so he stayed to watch out the loophole windows

What did they say they need to keep in every bastion from now on? water

They call out "All is well!" frequently. Do you think this has an effect on their state of mind, even when all is not well?

Chapter 15 (pp 144-153) -The Refugee

BEFORE READING:

How do you feel when the weather outside is fierce, windy, and rough?

Tell about a time when you dreaded something awful about to happen. How did you feel while you waited? What did you do to pass the time while you waited? What was the awful thing? Did it turn out to be so awful?

AFTER READING:

What was Louis' plan to find out if the Mohawk Indians were still watching from the nearby woods? He put a pumpkin on a stick with a soldier's hat on top of it and walked it along so that it barely showed over the palisade wall. When the Mohawks fired at the "head," they knew they were still out there and they could not relax their vigilance.

Who returns to the fort at night? Jacques Brunet

Who else escaped from the Mohawk camp? Antoine

Where did Antoine go? to Sorel to get help for Verchères

How much time did they have to wait for the attack? Only 5-6 hours

Chapter 16 (pp 154-163) - Warning

BEFORE READING:

What do you do to get ready for a special occasion, like Easter Sunday Mass or Christmas dinner? Be descriptive!

AFTER READING:

Who is Onontio? Governor de Frontenac

How did Antoine and Jacques escape? Antoine burned his ropes on a coal from the fire and then untied Jacques – at night when they weren't being watched

Who is the only one who knows how to fire the cannon? La Bonté

Why isn't Alexandre afraid to die? "Father Dollier says God is merciful to those who are brave and do their best."

Chapter 17 (pp 164-170) – Brave Hearts Await the Dawn

BEFORE READING:

Tell about a time when you prayed and felt better immediately after praying.

AFTER READING:

Why do you think the Indians didn't attack as the mission Indian had said they would?

"God indeed is my salvation; I am confident and unafraid. For the LORD is my strength and my might, and he has been my salvation." ~ Isaiah 12:2

How does Madeleine handle being weary and disheartened? She goes to the chapel to pray for strength and courage

Fonatine and Madeleine discover why the Indians didn't attack the night before... why didn't they? Because the extra Indians who were traveling to come help hadn't arrived yet

What was Madeleine worried had happened to Antoine? she was worried that he had been killed or captured, but had not reached Sorel to get help

Chapter 18 (pp 171-181) - Sounds From the River

BEFORE READING:

Have you ever arrived to a destination and found things to be different from the way you expected them to be? How were they different? Was it good or bad that they were different?

AFTER READING:

What happened to Madeleine when she went in the manor house after midnight to get a bowl of soup? She fell asleep!

Who came to get Madeleine? Jacques

Who arrived at the fort? Monsieur de la Monnerie and his men

Who sent La Monnerie? the governor – De Callières

Why is La Monnerie so surprised that only Madeleine, Louis, Alexandre, Laviolette, Fontaine, Gatchet, and La Bonté were defending the fort? Because Madame de Verchères thought there were 10 militiamen there to guard them, not only the 2 who were left.

Chapter 19 (pp 182-192) - Madeleine Resigns Her Command

BEFORE READING:

Tell about a time when you were really tired and dirty (after camping, hiking, playing outside). How did it feel to get cleaned up and sleep in your bed after that?

AFTER READING:

How many men did La Monnerie bring with him? 40

What did Madeleine do for the first time in a week? took a hot bath, dressed up for dinner, combed her hair

Who was rescued and returned? Antoine

Why doesn't Louis trust the Christian Indians? Because one of them relished in the notion of the attack on the fort when he spoke to Antoine and Jacques at the Mohawk camp

What does Madeleine give back to Louis? His hunting knife

What does Louis call his sister? "Mon capitaine"

Chapter 20 (pp 193-198) - Peace Once Again

BEFORE READING:

AFTER READING:

What news did the messenger bring? Madame de Verchères was returning the next day

How did Madeleine's father find out about the siege and her actions? Pierre Fontaine and his wife went to Quebec and told him about her bravery and their actions.

Why did Madeleine cry when her mother (Maman) returned? She knew she felt safe
