*A preposition is a joining word. It joins a noun or a pronoun to the rest of the sentence. To know whether a word is a preposition, say the preposition word and ask <i>What</i> or <i>Whom</i> . If the answer is a noun or pronoun, then the word is a preposition and should be labeled with a P .												
An object of the preposition is a noun or pronoun after the preposition in a sentence and should be labeled with an OP .
