

CHAPTERS 1-2

Section Summary

It is 1541 when the story begins. Esteban is in jail in the town of Vera Cruz in what is now Mexico. The jailer is giving him favors for the promise of drawing a map of Cibola, a place believed to be filled with gold.

Esteban reflects on how he came to be in prison. His story begins aboard the San Pedro, a ship sailing up the western coast of New Spain (Mexico). The ship is supposed to be meeting up with General Coronado, who is exploring inland looking for the lost city of gold. Captain Mendoza, a captain in Coronado's army, thinks the admiral of the San Pedro is not leading them in the right direction, so he plans to mutiny. He wants young Esteban to join him; he says he needs a map maker to chart the unknown territories. Before Esteban can decide what to do, the Admiral announces that Captain Mendoza and others are going ashore; the Admiral had discover Mendoza's plan and now he is sending away Mendoza and the other conspirators. They look to Esteban to volunteer to go with Captain Mendoza, and after some hesitation, he does.

CHAPTERS 9-10 Section Summary

Coronado and his men reach a place called Red House that was supposed to be filled with gold, but it is an old abandoned village. Only an old couple is there to greet them. The old man speaks of a place called Hawikuh that is said to be filled with gold. Later, Mendoza confronts the old man away from others and threatens him. The old man puts a curse on Mendoza.

Esteban is taken before the Royal Audiencia, and says that Mendoza found the treasure. Esteban can't say where the treasure is, but he says it is written in his notes and maps. Captain Martin comes to visit Esteban after his meeting with the Audiencia. Section Summary

Mendoza gives Esteban a gun and sword before the fight at Hawikuh. Esteban gives his maps and notes to Zia to protect. Coronado leads the attack, but is seriously injured. Esteban ends up in a hand-to-hand fight with someone about his own age. When Esteban can't bring himself to kill the voung Cibolan, Mendoza shows up and finishes him off. They find no gold. Zia helps to nurse Esteban back to health. Mendoza is to take a small group and head north and west, Esteban is going with him to map the territory; he gets Mendoza to take Zia as his scout. Zia is happy to go. She seems to be getting close to Esteban, though he doesn't seem to realize it. Esteban tells the court that Mendoza and his group found gold, and it took eight mules and five horses to carry it. It is now hidden somewhere, and Esteban says he is the only one who knows where it is hidden. He will need his notes to draw a map to the spot; his notes are still on the way. Don Felipe tells Esteban when they are alone, that he expects him to draw him a map from the notes before he turns them over to the court. Esteban implies his notes will not be good enough to reveal the spot where the gold is hidden.

When the sheep herder discovers the sheep have been slaughtered, there is much lamenting amongst the people of Nexpan. Mendoza plans a quick escape before Chief Quantah can plan any retribution, or close the only path out of the valley. Mendoza decides to start a fire as a distraction. Mendoza, Roa, and Zuniga carry out the fleeces they can carry. Zuniga goes back for another fleece, and is caught in the fire.

At the trial, the royal fiscal begins to question Esteban about his relationship with Mendoza. He then accuses Esteban of killing Mendoza, and that he can prove it. The royal fiscal's witness is Torres the horse handler.
